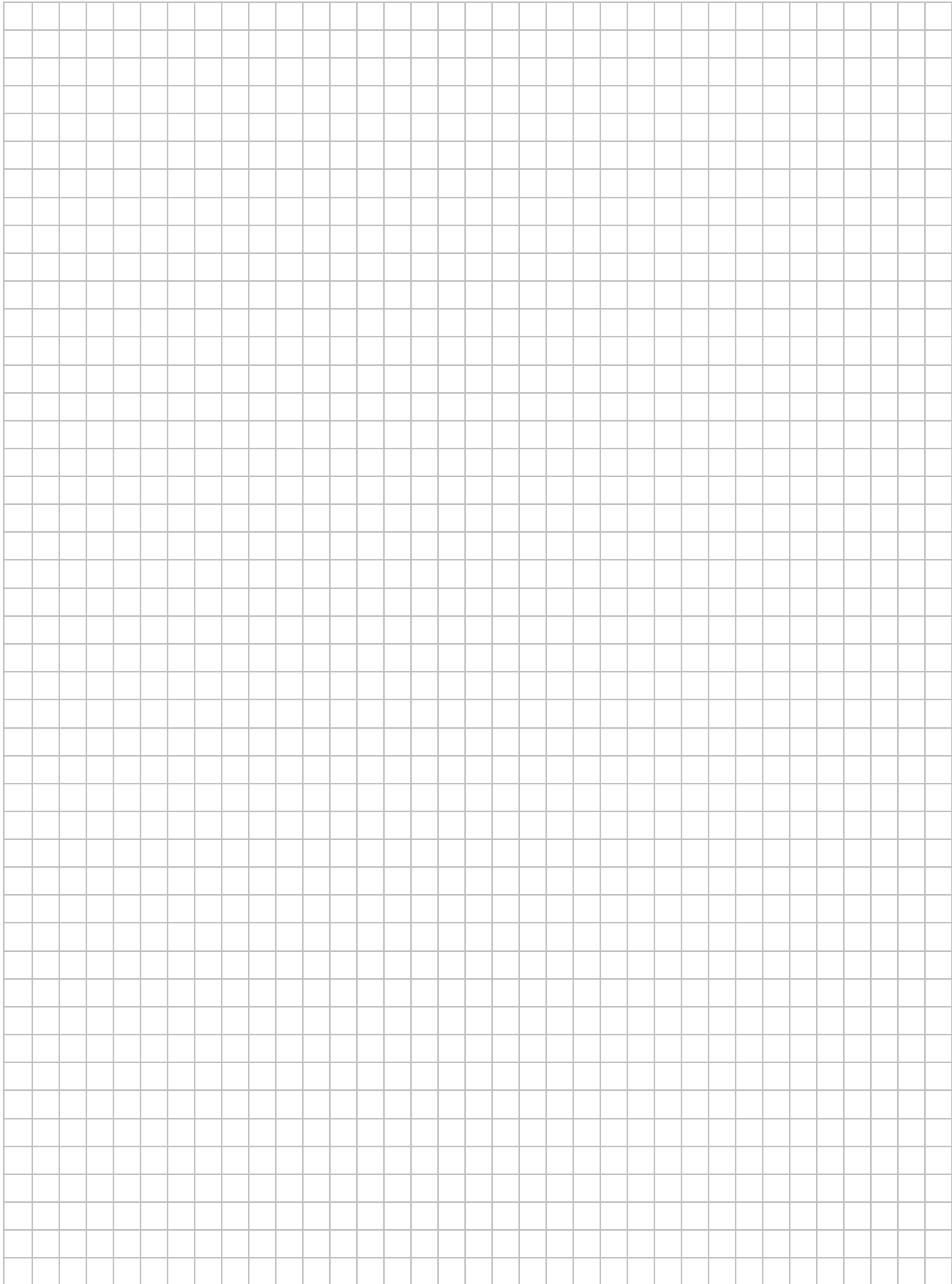

Step 1: Measuring Instructions

Draw the floor plan and indicate the dimensions adjacent to the corresponding wall. These measurements are not expected to be 100% correct; they are to give our designer an idea of the space he or she will be working with. When you are ready to move forward on a proposed design, our designer will come measure out the space free of charge.

- i) Measure the room from wall to wall. Measure each wall once and when the whole room is done, measure it again in reverse order. This is where you hear the old saying: "Measure twice, cut once."
- ii) Indicate all window and door openings from the outside of the window casing or door trim. Measure from the floor to the bottom and top of the casing.
- iii) Locate the center of sinks and appliances (even if the positions might change). Measure the centers from a specific wall or corner; indicate which wall you took the measurement from.
- iv) Measure the height from the floor to the ceiling. Make sure to indicate if there are any bulkheads over existing cabinets. Bulkheads can be hollow or contain pipes and ductwork; this can be difficult to determine without original blueprints.
- v) Indicate where electrical outlets are. Indicate if the outlet is double gang, single switch or standard plug.
- vi) Bring in blueprints from the architect or builder. This will be very helpful but exact measurements are still a must.

Step 2: Develop your Wish List

- i) Look through design magazines and clip out pictures of kitchens, bathrooms or closets that suit your needs.
- ii) Collect as many photos as possible.
 - a. Snap photos of kitchens, bathrooms or closets that appeal to you.
 - b. Bring photos with you so you can share your desires with your designer.
- iii) Bring in desired colour samples and various finishes in your home.
 - a. Flooring samples and wall colours in and around your kitchen are ideal to bring with you when you meet with your designer.

Step 3: Appliance Information

If you plan to purchase new appliances, then you will require exact specifications and measurements. If you are going to keep your current appliances, simply bring those appliance measurements with you.
